### Task 3.3: Communication

**Week Nine-Eleven**

**Task 4.1: Evaluation - collect evidence**

Speak to families, staff and pupils. Ask them what difference they have noticed since implementing your action plan and what changes they would like to see to improve further engagement.

You can collect this information through questionnaires, informal interviews, focus groups or surveys - it's up to you to make it work for your school.

## Week Twelve

### Task 4.2: Review & Feedback

Meet with your team to evaluate your parental engagement action plan. Discuss what has worked well and what improvements you could make.

Once you have collated your findings, present your outcomes to stakeholders and celebrate your achievements so far.

Agree the next steps to keep up momentum.
